

Gow-Gates - Dressage Person of the Year Award

The Gow-Gates Award was introduced in 1991. It was initiated after discussions with Mr Anthony Gow-Gates whose company, Gow-Gates, offered to sponsor a special "services to the sport" award each year.

This award was created to recognise and reward a person each year, who in the members' opinion, had made a significant contribution to the advancement of the sport of dressage over the past 12 months.

Currently, the membership of Dressage NSW is invited to send in nominations for this award by a closing date that is set each year. The general membership then has the opportunity to cast their vote for one of the candidates nominated for the award for that year.

The person nominated can be a Rider, Trainer, Judge, Volunteer, Organiser, Committee Member or anyone involved with other aspects of the sport. The person nominated can be from anywhere in NSW. The Awards are open to all members. Both the person being nominated and the nominator must be a current member of Dressage NSW.

The winner of this Award is announced and presented with a trophy at the Annual Equestrian Federation (NSW) Awards Night held annually each year.
