Horse Arrivals

- Horse Arrivals: **Tuesday 29th August after 2.00pm ONLY**. SIEC will not accept arrivals before this time.
- Horse arrival times are during day light hours only. Wednesday 30th August arrival time is 8am to 6pm and on competition days, between 6.30am to 6.00pm daily.
- There will be no riding available on Tuesday 29th August due to previous events being held at SIEC before the Championships.
- It is compulsory on arrival at the venue for all competitors to submit complete a “**Bio Security Declaration**” form before arrival. The Declaration form will be available on the Championships Webpage. The form can only be filled in three days out from the event. Link to form will be placed on the competitor information page.

- A final revised draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system will apply. **The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the evening before the competition.**
- The event will use the BlackHorse eDressage scoring system. Test papers will be emailed to competitors as soon as the Ground Jury has signed off on the competition.
- A link to the results will be posted on the event webpage.

Pony Measuring

- Pony measuring will be available on Thursday 31st August from 10.30am to 1.00pm. Cost is \$35 per horse (his will cover the measurer’s travel and expenditure) Bookings can be made on nominate.
- You will need your pony’s Registration Papers and your pony must also have a bit in its mouth.
- Measuring form is on the event website which you will need to have filled out and bring with you.
- **Ponies without a current height certificate will not be allowed to compete.**
- Riders who need to be measured have been notified.

Horse Familiarisation

Withdrawals and Refunds

- Withdrawals (scratchings) and Refunds: No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours of its commencement without the permission of the OC. A written statement (withdrawal form) giving reasons for any withdrawal must be provided to the Secretary of the Event prior to the commencement of the competition. (Refer rule 10.4). Penalty for non-compliance is a maximum fine of AU\$200, horses with drawn may be subject to a veterinary inspection.
- Withdrawal Forms will be available the indoor Event Office

- Entry fees will not be refunded unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the completion of the Championships. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the O.C. The administration fee will not be refunded. Fees for stables/tack/cabins/camp sites will be refunded if not used.
- Fees for stables/tack/cabins/camp sites will not be refunded for competitors who depart earlier than indicated on the entry form.

General Information

- This Event will run under the current dressage rules. <https://www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules>. It is the competitor's responsibility to know the rules of competition.
- Admission is free, please share this around. Spectators are most welcome to attend.
- All competitors can collect their Riders Bags from the event Rider Info Office located at the Event Square in front of the stables from Wednesday afternoon. For those doing day parking don't forget to pick up yours too!
- Reminder: Competition rules/conditions apply once horses arrive at the venue.
- Please ensure you promote our event through your social media #dnswstates2023 and tag event on FB. Also tagging the relevant sponsors for your class would be great, these can be found on the draw. Without sponsors support events like this would not happen.
- Riders at all levels must have their horse's EA papers available for inspection if requested. Swabbing will take place. Penalty fines will be imposed for those who do not have their horse papers available at the event. If you need to call a vet to attend to your horse while at the event, the Organising Committee MUST be notified.
- GEAR CHECK - Under the current EA Dressage rules, it is compulsory for every horse and rider combination to have a gear check for every test they ride. Gear check will take place prior to each test unless otherwise specified by the stewards.
- Lights- there is limited lighting around the grounds, therefore NO RIDING AFTER DARK, with the exception of those competing in the indoor which is finishing late.

Callers

- No test may be commanded. (EA and FEI Tests)
- Para-Equestrian
 - The official FEI PE Tests must be carried out entirely from memory, and all movements must follow in the order laid down in the test.
 - Except for those riders who may have their tests commanded and/or called as a compensating aid as listed on the FEI PE or EA PE ID Card.

Saddlery & Equipment

- Identification (ID) numbers (bridle numbers) Please use your existing bridle number. In the case of a double up of numbers, the OC will allocate one of the combinations with a temporary bridle number for this event. Please note that ID numbers (one on each side) must be displayed on the horse's saddlecloth, bridle and/or halter at all times other than when in the stable. This rule applies to all horses.
- WHIPS & GEAR - A reminder that whips that do not comply with current EA rules (must not exceed 1.2m in entirety for horses, and 1.0m for ponies), will not be allowed in the warm-up and competition areas. A whip may be carried in all Preliminary, Novice, Elementary, Medium, and Advanced competitions.
- Whips ARE NOT PERMITTED in the FEI Competitions at a State Championship
 - In FEI-level competitions at Australian and any State Championships a rider:
 - circling the arena carrying a whip will incur a technical fault of 0.5% from each judge
 - entering the dressage arena with a whip will incur a technical fault of 0.5% from each judge (this is not an error of course)
 - Carrying a whip in a test for more than 3 movements will entail elimination

Day Parking

- **Day parking is in P1 - Main Arena Truck Park above the main arena ONLY**
- Day yards are available in the Main Arena Truck Park. Horses may not be left in day yards overnight.
- Riders bringing horses for arena familiarisation prior to the day of competition are required to book and pay for day parking for that day on the late entry bookings. SIEC charge a fee per horse.

Dogs

- Dogs must be on leash at all times and please don't bring dangerous or aggressive dogs to the event.
- Dogs are permitted in the stables but must be on a lead and supervised at all times.
- PLEASE do not tie dogs in the aisles or leave them unattended.

Bikes

- Bicycles – If you have a bicycle at home, we suggest you bring it along as the distance from the stables to arenas is significant. S.I.E.C. management requests that helmets be worn.
- The roads are designated “public roads” and normal road rules apply, please be aware horses have always right of way.
- The internal roads of SIEC are PUBLIC roads so we are bound by NSW traffic rules and regulations – eg. Seat belts to be worn. Neither the Organising Committee nor the EA accepts responsibility for any accident relating to the use of motorised vehicles on the grounds at any time.
- Bikes and other modes of transport are not allowed in the stable area.
- Prams not permitted in stable aisles for safety reasons.
- Bikes are not permitted in the stables.
- **The riding of electric powered scooters is illegal on public roads in NSW and not permitted at SIEC.** PLEASE do not bring your electric scooter.
- If riding a bicycle or non-powered scooter at SIEC helmets are mandatory.
- Golf buggies or similar are permitted only during unloading of gear on arrival or loading of gear on departure.

Stabling/Tack Rooms

- Competitors, please place a notice containing the contact details of the person responsible for the horse in the “information pocket” located in front of each stable door in case of emergency.
- The stable allocation will be posted on the website prior to the event.
- Bedding: Any bedding requested during the event must be paid for at the time of ordering, payments for extra bedding using nominate can be shown to Stable Manager for collection
- SMOKING is not permitted in stables or stable aisles.
- Note: A limited number of rakes/shovels and wheelbarrows will be available, but please bring your own feed/water buckets. Bedding ordered with stable bookings will be placed in the stable. A limited supply of bedding will be available to purchase at the venue at \$15.00 per bag of shavings. Bookings will remain open on Nominat. Please advise the feed merchant of your stable number if you are ordering a delivery of feed.
- Lunging Yards in the stable area are for lunging horses only, no horses are to be left unsupervised in the lunge yards at any time.
- EA Stallion Policy applies. If your horse is a stallion, the EA Stallion Identification Card with a green background must be placed on the outside of the stable or yard. Download the card from the EA website.
- All stallions must be stabled.

Stabling Cleaning

- Stable cleaning. As per the conditions of entry, a cleaning fee/bond of \$87 per stable has been paid with entries. This fee will be not refunded if the stables are not left completely empty and clean. All bedding is to be removed and stables swept prior to departure. Please ensure private and shared tack rooms are also left swept clean prior to departure.

To ensure delivery, please tel/fax your order in time for the delivery on these days and advise Feed Merchant of your stable number.

Camping & Cabins

- Camping and cabin allocation will be posted on the DNSW website.
- Changes or additions to camping requests can be made on the Nominat link under ‘Late bookings’.
- Vehicles parked in camping area that are not campers may be towed away.
- Please do not block the camping area with your vehicles.
- Large trucks and short stay campers will be allocated camping in the North Camp/car Park or P1
- All camping vehicles must have a power lead, that has been tested and tagged by a certified person, connecting to the power outlets. Please make sure that any leads you have connected to power have a current approved tag attached to the lead or you may be disconnected from power. Please note SIEC charges us for each lead so if you have multiple leads plugged in you need to pay for each plug.
- Cabin keys: A \$10 deposit for cabin keys is payable and refunded on return of the key. Some cabins may have different people checking in and out. Cabins should be vacated by midday.
- Car Parking: Car parking is available on site. Please follow instructions from the Centre Management staff regarding where to park your vehicles. Floats/trucks/cars can be parked along the roadway opposite the cabins. Vehicles are not allowed in the competition and training areas. Please do not block access to camp sites and cabins with vehicles or floats.

- Facilities: We request that competitors take the utmost care in looking after the wonderful facilities provided. SIEC is located within a Regional Park and is environmentally sensitive. Please take pride in this fantastic venue and keep the toilets and amenities block clean.
- Please take care when walking in bush areas as snakes are about. A large goanna and friend are common visitors to the area around the rider retreat and camping areas.
- Competitors who don't comply with the instructions of persons delegated by the OC to manage the camping areas or the venue staff will be re-located in the north camp area. Competitors with a history of not following instructions will be allocated a North Camping area site.

Prize Money

- The Organising Committee reserves the right to review the prize money allocation for competitions, specifically:
 - Where a competition has fewer than 3 entries, prize money will be paid to 1st only
 - Competitions with 5 entries or fewer, prize money will be paid to 1st & 2nd place only
 - Competitions with 10 entries and below, prize money to 3rd place
- Goods in Kind will replace prize money in some competitions.
- Prize money will be credited to competitors within 10 working days after the event via Electronic Funds Transfer.

FEI Freestyle Competitions

- Freestyle Music will need to be uploaded using the following link: <https://dnsr.rts-online.com.au/>
- Freestyle competitors: We will be testing music prior to the event and no times have been set for music testing other than for the Grand Prix Freestyle. If you want to check your music you may enquire at the event office.
- GP Freestyle competitor's music tests will be held in the Indoor arena on Sunday morning from around 6.30am to 7.30am. Riders may note the time they would like on the timetable at the Rider Info Office otherwise they will be allocated in order of the draw.

COMPETITION FEI Intermediate Freestyle to Music - 40 - Open, 41 - AOR, 42 - Pony

A score of 58% in the qualifying Intermediate I competition is required to be eligible to start in the Intermediate Freestyle competition. Competitions will be limited depending on time constraints. The 15 highest ranked Open Riders, 5 highest ranked AOR Riders and 3 highest ranked Pony Riders will be allocated a start providing they have met the qualifying score of 58%. If AOR and Pony numbers are lower these spaces will be filled with the next highest-ranking combinations from competitions 43-44.

COMPETITION 45: FEI Medium Tour Freestyle to Music

A score of 58% in the qualifying FEI Intermediate A or B competition is required to be eligible to start in the Freestyle competition. Competitions will be limited depending on time constraints. Max 10 horses/ponies will be accepted. Nominations from horses and ponies entered in classes 39 & 40 will be accepted.

COMPETITION 48: FEI Grand Prix Special

The Grand Prix Special is limited to the best 15 combinations entered that gain at least 58% in the Grand Prix. Participation is not compulsory for combinations that qualify, and entry fees will be refunded to the combinations that enter and do not qualify. This competition may be cancelled if less than 3 entries are received.

COMPETITION 49: FEI Grand Prix Freestyle

The Grand Prix Freestyle is limited to the best 15 combinations entered that gain at least 58% in the Grand Prix. Participation is not compulsory for combinations that qualify, and entry fees will be refunded to the combinations that enter and do not qualify.

COMPETITION 915-921: FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyle

Entry to the Freestyle will be based on the combined average score in the A & B competitions. A score of 60% or higher is required. Only one horse per rider allowed.

Arrival at SIEC

Arrival at Sydney International Equestrian Centre (S.I.E.C.) Access to SIEC is via Saxony Rd. Saxony Rd is approximately 1km south (towards Elizabeth Drive) of the Horsley Drive intersection on Wallgrove Rd. There is a roundabout on Wallgrove Rd at Saxony Rd. Once on Saxony Rd there is another roundabout approximately 800m east into the entrance of SIEC. Once inside the SIEC follow the new access road along past the indoor arena and on to the stables. Proceed to horse unloading area in front of the stable block. After unloading horses, tack, and feed, please move your vehicle without delay either to the assigned camping location or to the car/float parking area.

SIEC is located just off the new M7 motorway. Coming from the north you take the Horsley Park exit, turn right at the exit and then turn left into Wallgrove Road. Coming from the South, you take the Elizabeth Drive exit, go straight ahead at the traffic lights along Wallgrove Road, then into Saxony Road. There is a toll on the M7 which you can pay within 48 hours.

FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all those involved in equestrian sport to attain the highest possible levels of education in their areas of expertise relevant to the care and management of the competition horse.
