1. Alternative sources of revenue



Club Funding



- There are many opportunities for sporting clubs to find different forms of funding for such things as:
 - Capital works (club houses, storage facilities etc)
 - Equipment (arena surrounds, trailers to carry equipment etc)
 - Development of judges and volunteers (stewards etc)
- Where are the funding opportunities?
 - EA, ENSW and DNSW
 - Local government
 - State government
 - Commonwealth government



2. Where to look







EA

Each year EA offers club grants (equipment and facilities upgrade categories) – watch for application openings

ENSW

Development Projects Program for 2017 (old SPF) Funding is available to Equestrian NSW affiliated Clubs. Funding is available for Projects costing up to \$3,000. The proposed projects must be delivered in FY 2017

In March 2017, Expressions of Interest will be invited for projects to be delivered in FY18.

\$50,000 per electorate available – amounts per project type:

- •Sport Development \$2,000
- •Community Sport Events \$5,000
- •Sport Access \$5,000
- •Facility Development \$20,000.

Organisations must contribute to the project Can be financial or voluntary labour, donated materials and/or equipment.

3. What makes a good submission?



How to approach your submission



Prepare

- Be aware of the various grants that are available and think about which ones you want to apply for
- Make sure you register early and make it a priority to back your submission
- Submissions are usually scalable the more money requested the more effort required

Plan

- Do a budget preliminary budgets and evidence where possible (quotes)
- Work out your project timelines
- Identify the groups that will benefit from your project
- Attach documents to your application

Write

- Be clear and concise
- Don't add information that is not relevant
- Answer the questions
- Don't forget the What, When, Why, Who and How

How to approach your submission



Check

- Get someone else to look over the submission with a fresh set of eyes get them to replay back to you what you are asking for (What, When, Why, Who and How)
- Complete any checklist that may be provided to ensure you have completed the relevant parts and attach any documents required

Submit

- Make sure you are on time you are competing with many other organisations so late submissions are not accepted
- Keep a copy of the submission and the timelines about when they should be notifying the success of the application

Submissions for 2018 open in March

- Grants that develop the sport, in particular
 - horse welfare,
 - youth participation,
 - regional development or
 - show creative initiatives to improve the profile of the sport
- Capital and equipment projects are permitted, but will be a lower priority
- Officials education is available under a different category
