Note: some activities may use a combination of categories and requirements if the activity spans across two or more categories. *If an equestrian activity is unable to provide the MMRR as Recommended an alternate Medical Response Plan (MRP) must be submitted to the State Branch 14 days prior to the commencement of the equestrian activity for review, support, and approval.
