

Kallista Field is regarded as one of New Zealand's leading dressage riders and trainers. She has competed at two World Equestrian Games, and one Olympic Games – each time on different home-grown horses. Kallista also studied under the great Herbert Rehbein at Grönwohldhof, Germany. There she had the privilege of riding famous stallions, Don Primero, and Donnerhall

As the first New Zealander to compete at Olympic level, Kallista and Waikare finished a creditable 16th place at the Sydney 2000 Olympics (after the international discards) - joining the final trot-up and only 0.37% (1.62 marks) from a start in Grand Prix Kür finals. No New Zealander has achieved this since.

Kallista's success is in no small amount due to her training with Clemens Dierks, Saskia Ostermeier, and her immensely experienced and talented mother, Sharon Field.

In 2024, Kallista's contribution to Dressage in New Zealand and her indisputable talent was celebrated when she was inducted into the Equestrian Sports NZ Hall of Fame.

Being a busy mum with a daughter and running her equestrian establishment, Kallista's recent focus has been developing her GP mount, Felix Westfalia FE, as well as producing sound, well trained and mannered horses that have sold both in NZ and around the world.
